

The Administration of the British Community

The British Community (BC) will not extend its organisation to the following parts of the UK:

London

Berkshire

Buckinghamshire

Essex

Hertfordshire

Kent

Surrey

(East and West) Sussex.

The reason is these comprise the Home Counties and London. These have sufficient financial resources to provide for their population under a hard Brexit from the UK government in London in any circumstances. Additionally it is advisable that the administration of the BC be minimal whilst at the same time having maximum effect, so that its provision of resources may be more efficient in the areas in which it operates.

The BC will appoint by democratic methods personnel to determine who can perform tasks which the BC administration requests be performed.

The BC will request assistance in the provision of its services. It will pay for these services in Brits.

The BC requests assistance from competent technologists and professional administrators which BC accepts in the organisation of its administrative infrastructure.

This administrative infrastructure will include the provision of telecommunications services, a banking sector and means of communicating with residents of the BC. For instance, it may set up an autonomous TV service.

Multiply secure units of technological infrastructure will be based in Glasgow and Waterford in the Republic of Ireland. Local BC communications and infrastructure will be transportable and accessible via a distributed system based in the BC. It is advisable that the distributed system be advanced, dynamically modifiable and secure, connected with primitive systems in reserve.
