

## **Tirade and accommodation**

In the Soviet Union, people were frequently informed that they were in a state of Socialism and Communism could not be attained in the short-term, but sometimes that Communism was a long-term goal.

The frequent response at least inside the mind, was we know full-well the system is imperfect, we could go on at length why it is so, but you do not allow us to tell you this, because the idea we could boot you out would become explicit.

We are faced in the UK with a political semi-fascist system with a democratic façade whose incompetence is legendary and which has gone berserk. If we are to allow that we may be implementing something considerably worse, and there should be suitable constraints on our behaviour so that we ourselves do not go out of control, then there may be a possibility of introducing something more sensible.

If these changes are always conditioned by criticism from those that know, and interior reflection on what we must do, and sometimes even the decisive rejection of that criticism, or otherwise its modification so that people understand what we are trying to do, and occasional acceptance that criticism has hit a bulls-eye, I think the transition to the BC will not be too bad.
